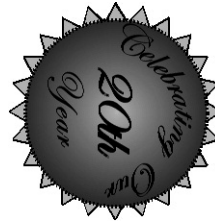

## PARKING

### Parking on Caldwell College Campus

A parking decal is required to park on campus. You will be ticketed if you park in areas designated Visitor, Faculty, or Staff.



**Note: An LLI parking sticker is good indefinitely or until you change cars. There is no need to reapply each semester.**

The best entrance to use for parking is indicated by "\*" on the map.

### PARKING FOR CALDWELL PUBLIC LIBRARY

Enter Provost Square and turn right onto the upper level of the parking deck behind the library. Enter the library from Bloomfield Avenue unless you are a dedicated stair-climber.

For those able to walk longer distances, there is parking at Calandra's.



### PARKING FOR THOSE WITH DISABILITIES

A limited number of Handicapped Spaces can be found in front of the Administration Building, the Newman Recreation Center, the Library, and the Visceglia Arts Center. There are a larger number of spaces near the first entrance to the upper part of the parking lot.

**If walking is difficult for you, try to car pool.**
